Katy Ferreira, about to turn 21, has not left her bedroom in two years. In fact, she has not left her bed – at 360 kg/800 lbs, she physically can't. Katy tries to make the best of a bad situation. She does the crossword in the Herald newspaper her mother brings home, consumes the food she craves – biscuits, pies, doughnuts, litres of fizzy drinks – and waits in hope for insulin and a solution to her plight. To pass the time she begins to compile her own crossword in one of the Croxley notebooks that have been unused since she dropped out of school. Within each cryptic clue is a message, an attempt to explain how it feels to be 'the fat girl', how taking comfort in sweet things as a grieving and lonely child escalated into a deadly relationship with food and a psychological and physical disease. The process triggers splintered memories of dark family secrets and hints of culpability. As Katy finds her voice – quirky, macabre, devastatingly astute and viciously funny at times – the notebooks fill up. NOT TO MENTION is part diary, part love-hate letter to the mother who fuelled her daughter's addiction as steadily as the world ostracised her.



Destined from birth to inhabit two very different worlds - that of her father, the wealthy Joseph Sakavungo, and that of her mother, his mistress - this emotive tale takes us to the heart of a young girl's attempts to come to terms with her own identity and fashion a future for herself from the patchwork of the life she was born into. Beautifully constructed, warm and wise, this is a novel that will transport the reader to a world in which we can all become more of the sum of our parts.


MY CHILDREN HAVE FACES

This well-wrought story is drawn from Campbell's firsthand knowledge of the karretjiemense (donkey cart people) of the Great Karoo, a vast area of parched earth and craggy mountains in South Africa. Through the voices of Kapok and Muis, the parents, and Fansie and Witpop, the two oldest children, we come to know an undocumented karretjiemense family and their bare-bones lifestyle. Kapok, who tries to find work where he can but uses alcohol to escape reality, is not concerned that the children don't have government-issued IDs. Muis feels differently: "Without government names, who will the police search for if they are lost?" Muis also worries that Kapok's desire to get his family out of the dry, hot veld and seek stability in the town of Leeu Gamka will get her killed. Miskiet, the man who raped her there 15 years earlier, reveals to readers that he holdsa murderous grudge. The characters' use of Afrakaans-interspersed English and their personal perceptions of circumstances expose the complexities of an often invisible culture. Vivid descriptions and underlying suspense unleash in readers the desire to absorb every detail of this poignant novel.

As a teenager Fred Khumalo greeted his friends with a handshake and the words 'touch my blood'. It implied friendship and trust. The saying became his name. Twice his father - the 'moegoe', the 'country bumpkin' - took him to inyangas to have the 'demons' banished. Twice his mother - the 'city girl' - took him to the doctor to have the 'fevers' cured. When the American Dudes became the fashion, Khumalo dressed up in outlandish style and strutted the streets. 'You had to be brave to be seen in the outfits that we wore. Green, yellow, maroon, powder blue. Outrageous stuff, garish stuff, bright stuff. Earth, Wind and Fire stuff. Michael Jackson (pre-nose job) stuff.' He smoked dagga with con men and criminals, he pickpocketed 'corpses' on Friday night trains. He worked as a gardener in the larney suburbs and drooled over pornographic photographs with his baas's son. He studied journalism and shacked up with whiteys in a commune called Snake Park, for a while the only darkie in a crazy swirl of booze and drugs and sex. And then the bloody fightings that tore apart KwaZulu/Natal in the 1980s touched his life. Sucked him into a place of horror and violence that threatened to destroy him. When a friend died in his arms with the words 'They really got me, Touch My Blood. They really got me, Khumalo realised that if he was to outlive the madness he had to run. From the journalist and Sunday Times columnist comes a startlingly honest, humorous and poignant autobiography about growing up in a time of laughter and heartache.







Like her previous work this story is a piece of social realism but, for the first time, Campbell introduces hints of magical realism – which is very much in keeping with the world view of the people she writes about.

The shark swims away, leaving the two of them stunned upon the shore. Deeply traumatized, Stella invites the surfer, Ben Hume, into her home to dry off and recover. Ben is much younger than Stella, a waterman who paints trawlers for a living. There is an almost instant attraction between the two but Stella is married to American financier Jack Barlow and she and her husband are preparing to leave the country. But Stella is torn. Stella and Ben, bonded by trauma, begin a passionate affair despite Stella's better judgment. Jack finally confronts Stella over Ben and asks her to dump him, stay with him and leave Cape Town. Stella must choose one of the men, or to let them both go and to rebuild her home, her life, and her art on her own terms.








ZOLAJOHAN JACK SMITH GENRE






ACROSS THE KALA PANI

In 1909, four women board a ship in Madras to cross the Kala Pani, the 'black water', to Natal. Lutchmee, a young widow, has escaped her vengeful mother-in-law and self-immolation on her husband's funeral pyre. Vottie, from the Brahmin caste, is an educated girl whose abusive husband tries to hold on to his caste at all costs. Chinmah, heavily pregnant when she boards the ship, is married to an older man as part of an unpaid debt. Dazzling but shy Jyothi is single. On board the ship, the women will form friendships and alliances. They will help each other through trial and trauma, even after they arrive and are separated. Like many Indians desperate to escape unbearable conditions in their home country, these women are only too eager to believe what they've been told: that a better life awaits them in South Africa, where caste doesn't matter, food is plentiful, and liberty will be theirs after just five years. But the reality of life on the plantations reveals the truth about the crossing: that it is usually a oneway journey, rife with misery, and that the hardship doesn't end after the ship has dropped anchor in Durban harbour. The epic stories of these immigrants – the brave, the bold, the kind; the weak, the cruel, the cowardly - are woven into the fabric of South Africa's Indian population today. Shevlyn Mottai has drawn on her ancestors' history to highlight the bonds formed between women during adversity, and to celebrate their journeys of tragedy and triumph.





SISTERS OF THE CIRCUS

LAILA MANACK HISTORICAL DRAMA

As Noor pulled the curtain back and stepped up to the mirror to view herself, she gasped. She looked as if she'd been dipped in liquid gold. The fabric moulded to her like a second skin. Each time she twisted and turned the light reflected off her body like the ocean at sunset. The attendant handed her gold cuffs to slip onto her ankles. She dragged a chair to face the mirror and sat down to watch her sister's reaction. Kahina's eyes widened as she gave her body a once-over. Trapeze-artist twins Kahina and Noor are one of a kind. Kidnapped from their home in India, they were sold to a travelling circus in Europe at four years old. Now it's the Roaring Twenties, the girls are twenty-one, and they want to escape their circus trailer and abusive ringmaster and make their way to India to find their birth parents. The circus world is all they know: the daily drills in technique; the fittings for sumptuous costumes that will make their dark complexions shine and keep customers rolling up to buy tickets; the blue-andwhite striped tent with its coloured lights and the smell of popped kernels and melted caramel wafting through the stands; and their renowned double act: two young women leaping, tumbling and soaring above the audience. Yet beyond its glamour, Garret's circus is rife with cruelty. You're only as good as your last trapeze act, and secrets behind the curtain are sinister enough to kill. When Kahina is forced to train a handsome new recruit in the art of trapeze work, his disdain for rules pushes her out of her comfort zone and ignites a sequence of events that threaten to force the sisters apart. Laila Manack's debut novel is a vivid tale of the power of sisterhood and womanhood, trust and self-worth, flying and falling and getting up again, no matter what.




LOVES AND MIRACLES OF PISTOLA



A bond develops between the two women, something that takes both of them by surprise. Vivian de Klerk's sharp observations and brilliantly acerbic satirical wit make this multi-layered novel at once horrifying, shocking, poignant – and very, very funny.




THE WOLF HUNT




DEAD MEAT

Yet she and her family (mother Viv, former trophy wife, now hapless housewife; father Ray, former accountant, now handyman, and grandmother Eleanor) are trapped on an enormous factory farm in a world where climate change has left plant crops devastatingly rare, and the Corporation ensures meat is virtually all there is to eat. With grains grown exclusively for raising cattle, pigs and chicken for slaughter, and greens a black-market luxury, Natalie is emaciated, bitter and angry. She is desperate to escape, but electric fences and the draconian punishments of the Corporation stand in her way. In contrast to his sister, Flynn is passive, complacent to the horrors of the farm, and hobbled by guilt and shame over the abuse. With a pet rat his only friend, he goes about the daily grind, wishing for a way to make amends to Natalie, who bristles at his every advance. One night Flynn helps Natalie steal apples from the farmer's private orchard; the farmer's devious, arrogant 11-year-old son, Brett, sees them and threatens to tell, which would get them killed. In a scuffle on a wall overlooking the free-range pig pen, Natalie pushes Brett to his death, where he is eaten alive by the pigs. Afterwards, the entire farm is in fear, wondering who might be blamed and put to death. Quietly nightmarish and utterly gripping, the psychological horror DEAD MEAT has all the makings of a cult classic. It may be some time before you're able to eat a bacon sandwich again.

At the Edge of the Desert is a meditation on loss, isolation and love, which asks us to consider the implications of telling someone else's story.





Only years later in Johannesburg is she able to make sense of who she is and what her work might mean. Robert is a photographer in New York in the 1970s, desperate to make memorable images in a time of spectacular experimentation in dance, music and theatre. He intuits the importance of what he is photographing, but finds it almost impossible to transcend the troubles of his own life and achieve something great through his work. Paige leaves South Africa in the seventies to pursue her dream of being a ballet dancer. She does not anticipate the ways in which this pursuit will challenge her understanding of the art that she has known and practised all her life, and she is ill prepared for the catastrophic moment that will undo everything she has worked for. Unbeknownst to them, Thalia, Robert and Paige share a story that links them to one another, to the turbulent worlds of New York in the 1970s and South Africa in the 1990s and, finally, to the photographs that hold the secrets of their lives. NOTES ON FALLING is about the hope that art will challenge perceptions and orthodoxy so that the world can be reinvented through new forms. It is also about trying to reconcile the large pictures of history with the small snapshots of our individual lives.

So argued Prince Bernhard of the Netherlands, the founder president of the World Wide Fund for Nature (WWF), at a 1987 meeting with John Hanks, conservation expert and WWF's head in Africa. It was a controversial approach, all the more because it was working within apartheid South Africa in the late 1980s. When the existence of the project was finally leaked, WWF denied any involvement, and John Hanks took the fall. In Operation Lock and the War on Rhino Poaching, John Hanks finally tells the story of these explosive events from 25 years ago. As a leading international authority on conservation, he also deals with the scourge of rhino poaching up to the present, and gives powerful and controversial criticism of some of the current policies to curb poaching.

Using new insights based on original research, the book traces the circumstances of Cornelius Van Gogh's short life, from his pleasant childhood in the Netherlands, to his work in the gold-mining industry in the Transvaal Republic following his move to South Africa in 1889. The particulars of Cor's strained relationship with his famous brother are given, and his participation on the Boer side in the Anglo-Boer War is mapped out in greater detail, including his tragic demise in a hospital in Brandfort - one that holds a troubling resemblance to Vincent's own tragic end. Chris Schoeman's biography of the lesser-known Van Gogh brother reveals a side of art history never before explored with such scrutiny, recreating the last decade of nineteenth-century South Africa, and providing fresh analysis on a family that continues to intrigue both historians and the general public.


LIVING SHORES




THE LAST ELEPHANTS

The Last Elephants – is the title prophetic? We hope not, but the signs are worrying.




BEGGING TO BE BLACK




IN THE JAWS OF THE CROCODILE







The book is packed with information not included in the film, about Rodriguez's background, relationships and political activities, his tours to Australia, and the recognition that has finally come to him after the film's success.



His long-held dream of winning a third world title seemed an impossible one. Yet, Dingaan refused to give it up. He would not be denied. And then he proved it all over again. In doing so he would not only regain his crown as the champion of the people and once again be hailed as a unifying symbol in a racially divided nation, but he would also confirm his place alongside the greatest stars that boxing has ever produced.





In 1996 there is very little information about lupus available. For the first two years Kate is in and out of hospital, almost dying, always surviving. More than two decades later the word lupus has come into mainstream media. There's a recurring gag on the series House and Selena Gomez and Lady Gaga have both documented their struggles, but there is still no definitive text. Lupus is dangerous and difficult to define. There is a genetic tendency, but the trigger is environmental. It's nature and nurture. So, who in Kate's family had it? And what was her trigger? Mapping the journey of her colonial ancestry, mapping her body, Kate follows the vein: North China, opium, tea, shipping; Hong Kong, banking, HSBC, Shanghai and Peking; India in the early 1700s; Java, orphanages, missionaries in Penang; the first translation of the Chinese English bible; Amsterdam, New Amsterdam, loyalists, rebels, burghers, hangings; Rhodesia, Scotland and the Zambian copper belt; World Wars I and II; the Cape Colony, South Africa. From the 1600s to today, both sides of her family have documented and have been documented. Of course, there are also the hidden adoptions, the bad marriages and the secret families. Part of the journey will be uncovering the truth. Looking at the history of diagnoses, and unpacking and examining medical details, Kate demystifies this most mysterious of illnesses. She treats medical information in the simplest way possible, all the while exploring the language around illness, the history of lupus, how pain is communicated, and how patients are treated. In recent years epigeneticists have been investigating the role of inherited memory in genealogy. By tracing her family's path, Kate untangles some of the stories she's been told. But LUPUS LOVE STORY is also about the adventure: after three novels, it's time for Kathryn White to hunt the wolf in her own story.


MAYDAY OFF THE WILD COAST
